Classic Fiction: *Exciting Stories* – Exploring plot, characters and tension by reading Roald Dahl's 'Fantastic Mr. Fox'. The children will learn more about direct speech and tense and write their own stories.

Non-Fiction: *Diaries and Recounts* – Through reading 'The Day I swapped my Dad for Two Goldfish' and 'The Diary of a Killer Cat', we will explore and write recounts and study adverbs for time and place.

Topic Text - *Tales of Ancient Egypt* – The children will use this theme to write a biography and newspaper report. They will also learn more about different types of poetry. After reading 'The Egyptian Cinderella' by Shirley Climo, they will adapt a fairy tale into an Ancient Egyptian setting.

Are You Keen To Be Green?

RE, PSHE, MFL and Reasoning.

MFL - This term the children will learn to talk about how we get to school. They will learn a range of verbs related to travelling, arriving and leaving and will begin to conjugate these verbs in the "I" and "we" form. They will also continue to learn and practice numbers up to fifty in Spanish.

RE – People of Faith- The children will learn about the lives of people of faith from different religions. They will identify key events in their lives and how their faith and beliefs have inspired their lives and work.

PSHE – One World – Malawi This unit is based on a case study of a girl called Chiwa who lives in Malawi. The children will explore different aspects of her life in each lesson.

Mathematics

Fractions - naming, making, and drawing fractions, fractions on a number line, comparing fractions, equivalent fractions, ordering fractions, adding and subtracting fractions.

Time – Months and years, hours in a day, telling the time to the minute, the 24hour clock, using a.m. and p.m., measuring time in seconds.

Geometry – right angles, comparing angles, horizontal and vertical, parallel and perpendicular, 2-D and 3-D shapes.

Mass and Capacity – Measuring and comparing mass, adding and subtracting mass, comparing volume, measuring temperature.

Science

Living Things and Their Habitats - During this topic, the children will learn how to identify a range of British plants and animals, and how to classify organisms, including the use of classification keys. They will also consider why organisms live in different habitats and the impact, both positive and negative, that humans can have on environments.
