English

Fiction 2 - 'Traditional Tales.'

The beautiful book *The Wolf's Secret*, a new story in the traditional style, is the starting point for this block. Children will focus on the plot, rich language, design and layout alongside learning about adverbials and present perfect form.

Fiction 1 - 'Imaginative stories'

The Hole, by Oyvind Torseter. Children ask and answer questions and use inference skills to speculate about what is happening.

Poetry - List Poems and Kennings

Read and write list poems, including kennings. Explore devices such as similes, alliteration and onomatopoeia.

Non-Fiction 1 - 'Reports'

Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman and Wolves by Emily Gravett) for features of non-chronological reports. Use adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions of time/cause.

Mathematics

Place Value – Placing 3/4-digit numbers on a line, place value in 4-digit numbers, place value addition/subtraction, adding and subtracting powers of 10, nos > 1000, using place value in calculations.

Addition/Subtraction – Partitioning and column addition, mental addition and subtraction, using counting on to help with subtraction, mentally adding/subtracting near multiples, column subtraction.

Measures & Data – Telling the time on 12 and 24 hour clocks, recording and interpreting data, drawing line graphs.

Multiplication/Division – Doubling/halving, grid multiplication, division using chunking and the bus stop method.

Forces and Magnets
