
F3/4: **George W**, for working so hard in all his lessons, showing care and dedication to his work, focusing on his presentation and independence in lessons.

To take part, we ask for a £2 donation. All funds raised will go directly towards developing our school library, helping us to expand our collection and create an even more vibrant heart to our school.


Thank you for your support in making World Book Day a memorable and meaningful celebration for our school community.




Year 3 Writers!
